The Department of Accounting, University of Sri Jayewardenepura has launched a new project called Techno-Economic-Societal Sustainable Development Training in Sri Lanka (TESS).

Managing waste is challenging for all countries, but Sri Lanka encounters specific challenges. Higher educational institutions could play a leading role in addressing some of the waste management challenges.

The University of Sri Jayewardenepura is part of an international consortium under the rubric of Techno-Economic-Societal Sustainable Development Training in Sri Lanka (TESS), co-financed by the European Union through its Erasmus + Capacity Building in Higher Education program.

The consortium comprises three European Universities - University of South-Eastern Norway, University of Nova De Lisboa and University of Essex and Five Sri Lankan universities -.
